



Artificial Turf Care Guide

Maintaining and Inspecting Your Turf

Artificial turf is durable, but regular care and inspections help prevent damage and keep it performing its best.

- **Protect Heavy Items:** Place pads under furniture or equipment to avoid dents or pressure marks.
- **Avoid Sharp Tools:** Keep sharp objects away to prevent cuts or punctures in the turf.
- **Be Careful with Heat:** Don't set up barbecues, fire pits, or other hot items directly on the turf — high heat can cause melting.
- **Avoid Parking:** Do not park cars, bikes, or heavy machinery on the turf to prevent base damage.
- **Inspect Regularly:** Every 3–6 months, check for:
 - Uneven or lifted seams
 - Drainage problems or standing water
 - Fading or worn areas in high-traffic zones

General Cleaning

- **Weekly Rinse:** Use your garden hose to wash away dust, dirt, and pet waste
- **Spot Cleaning:** If something spills or stains, gently wipe the area with a damp cloth and a mild soap. Rinse with water when done.

Pet Care

Artificial turf is pet-friendly but needs a little extra attention.

- Pick up and rinse away solid waste right away
- Use a turf deodorizer to keep things smelling fresh.
- Brush the grass fibers now and then to keep them standing tall.

Winter:

- Avoid using salt or harsh chemicals — they can damage turf fibers.
- Use a plastic shovel to remove snow gently.
- Never use metal shovels or tools that could cut the turf.

Fall

- Clear away leaves and debris before winter with a blower or wide-prong rake.
- Make sure your drainage system is clear to handle fall rain.

Spring & Summer

- Remove leaves, twigs, and pollen regularly using a blower or rake.
- Watch for wear in high-traffic areas and schedule repairs if needed.
